PAIMI Program

The Nevada Disability Advocacy & Law Center (NDALC) is a private, nonprofit organization that serves as Nevada's federally-mandated, governor-designated protection and advocacy system for the human, legal, and service rights of Nevadans with disabilities.

NDALC provides services to individuals with mental illness pursuant to the Protection and Advocacy for Individuals with Mental Illness Act (PAIMI). The purpose of NDALC's PAIMI program is:

- To investigate allegations of abuse and/or neglect of individuals with mental illness; and
- To protect and advocate the rights of individuals with mental illness.

If you currently reside in Nevada and have a mental health diagnosis, you may be eligible to receive NDALC's assistance.

Please note: NDALC is not able or authorized to assist everyone. All requests for services will be assessed on a case-by-case basis and will be evaluated based upon NDALC's current service priorities.
