<p>JEEP (Job Exploration and Expectation Program)</p>	Work-Center to Competitive Employment	Students are given opportunity to work in various on-campus departments within the school setting, such as: Graphic Arts, Cafeteria, Custodial Department, Library, Nurses Office, Athletic Dept., etc...	Soft job and social skills necessary to increase opportunities to successful employment.	On several CCSD campuses throughout CCSD.	As determined by IEP team - One or more periods in the school day.	Available continuously from 11th grade through graduation to age 22	Student accesses same mode of transportation used to travel to high school campus.
<p>POST (Postsecondary Opportunities for Students in Transition)</p>	Work-Center	An IEP driven program with heavy supervision geared to teach life skills including vocational, community, and leisure/recreation skills Very little if any focus on academic skills	Students work on increasing independence in all life areas including: Vocational, Self-help, community interaction and social skills.	On CCSD campuses throughout CCSD. <p>JDPI (Job Discovery Program I)</p>	Enclave - Working in a group. 8:1 ratio	Partnership between Opportunity Village and CCSD. Provides vocational training in a natural environment for students whose disability is a barrier to competitive employment.	Industrial kitchen work/food prep; Custodial; Retail; and Child Care.	Opportunity Village Culinary Training Center, YMCA, Head Start Program, Lied Animal Shelter, OVI Thrift Store, and Clean the World. <p>PACE (Program Approach to Career Education)</p>	Supportive and Competitive Employment	Program emphasizes career, job seeking, work -related academics, independence, and self-determination skills. In some instances, the emphasis may be larger on vocational exploration and other off-campus work experiences.	On CCSD campuses throughout CCSD. 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JDP II (Job Discovery Program II)	Supported	For students requiring less supervision than POST/JDPI. May help students obtain jobs in the area upon completion of program. Project SEARCH	Competitive	Students must interview for positions and be able to work independently. Students are trained in various departments and placed in jobs throughout the year when they are ready. YES (Your Educational Success)	11th and 12th Grade college bound students. Register online	Geared towards helping students transition into college or vocational school from high school. To be eligible for a program, students must be:

- Credit-ready to graduation based on course of study; *
- Enrolled in the Clark County School District
- Ready to work and/or attain skills for employment
- Able to participate in on/off campus experiences

- Competitive – General employment without supports.
- Supported – Some guidance and support during employment such as a job coach.
- Enclave – constant supervision by agency worker while working in a group.
- Work Center – Heavy supervision performing 'piece work' at a central location.

Students access the POST and PACE programs through the IEP Process.
JDPI, JDPII, and Project SEARCH use an application/interview process.

Applications are due November – one year prior to the first day of attendance.
