WIPA Eligibility

Individuals eligible to receive services include Nevadan's with disabilities who are receiving:

- Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI),
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and
- Are between the ages of 14 and full retirement age, and
- Are actively seeking employment, have a job offer, are currently working or engaged in self-employment and are interested in receiving work related benefits counseling.



NOTES — WIPA provides beneficiaries with individualized information based on their particular situation. As such, beneficiaries will be asked to provide verification of federal, state, and local benefits received as accurate, individualized information and support cannot be provided without this crucial information.

Employment And Your Social Security Benefits

The Social Security Administration encourages beneficiaries to transition to paid employment and greater financial independence through the use of “work incentives.”

By utilizing work incentives, individuals can improve their quality of life without necessarily sacrificing all benefits.



What IS the Work Incentives Planning & Assistance (WIPA) Program?

The WIPA Program is a no-cost service that provides individualized benefits counseling to Social Security beneficiaries who are returning to work or entering the workforce for the first time.

CWICs — Community Work Incentives Coordinators will help beneficiaries understand how work may impact their cash and medical benefits while learning how work incentives can increase their self-sufficiency.
